



Covid-19 Impact Eligibility

Please review the following to successfully complete your program application. The following two requirements must be satisfied on the program application where requested.

- 1. Applicants must attest to the impact statement approved by the Governor's Office (see application)
- 2. Applicants must provide a description of how their attested impact falls into one of the following three categories (please review all categories most applicants will be able to attest impact in some way).

Impacted Class

- **a**. Households with income at or below 300% of Federal Poverty Guidance (FPG) for the size of household based on the most recently published <u>poverty guidelines</u> by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), **OR**
- **b**. Households with income at or below 65% of the Area Median Income (AMI) for the county and size of household based on the most recently published data by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) (utilize <u>SLFRF</u> <u>LMI tool</u> for additional guidance), **OR**
- c. Households that experienced unemployment, OR
- d. Households that experienced food or housing insecurity, OR
- e. Households that otherwise qualify for any of the following programs:
 - Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)
 - Childcare Subsidies through the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF)
 - Medicaid
 - Affordable Housing Programs Only National Housing Trust Fund (HTF) or Home Investment Partnerships Program (HOME)

Disproportionately Impacted Class

- a. Households residing in Qualified Census Tracts, OR
- **b**. Households with income at or below 185% FPG for the size of its household based on the most recently published poverty guidelines by HHS, **OR**
- **c**. Income at or below 40% AMI for its county and size of household based on the most recently published data by HUD (utilize <u>SLFRF LMI tool</u> for additional guidance), **OR**
- **d**. Households that otherwise qualify for any of the following programs:
 - Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
 - Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
 - Free and Reduced-Price Lunch (NSLP) or School Breakfast Programs (SBP)
 - Medicare Part D Low-Income Subsidies
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - Head Start and/or Early Head Start
 - WIC Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children
 - Section 8 Vouchers
 - Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
 - Pell Grants
